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## EFN Policy Statement

### EU Directive on Patients' Rights in Cross-border Healthcare

The EFN welcomes the EU Directive on Patients' Rights in Cross-border Healthcare, which is a major step forward to improve "Patients Rights", "Quality and Safety" and "Cooperation". The Common Values and Principles underpinning the healthcare system, "solidarity", "accessibility" and "sustainability" can only be achieved if:

- The system is NOT primarily based on the ability to pay; otherwise the EU will have a two-tier health system in which those who can afford to pay are served first.
- Patients coming from the lower cost Member States can NOT be exposed to top-up payments; otherwise the inequalities will increase within the EU.
- Continuity in patient care is ensured by setting out a clear line of responsibility. An EU patient's Ombudsman is an important mechanism to address complaints and to act as an advocate for the patient.
- A system is in place taking into account patient sensitive quality indicators.
